Bring photos or samples to our office to discuss your plant problems

 Master Gardener Volunteers offer homeowners answers and advice for common landscape and garden questions through their newly revised Horticulture Research Line.

 MGVs and county staff will endeavor to research your horticultural questions about plants or pests. Some plant problems can take more time than others to research, so please allow up to 1 week for a response from our research line volunteers.

In the event we cannot answer your question, there is also the OSU PLANT AND PEST DIAGNOSTIC CLINIC. If you so choose, you may mail your sample to the clinic for in-depth lab testing for plant pathogens.
