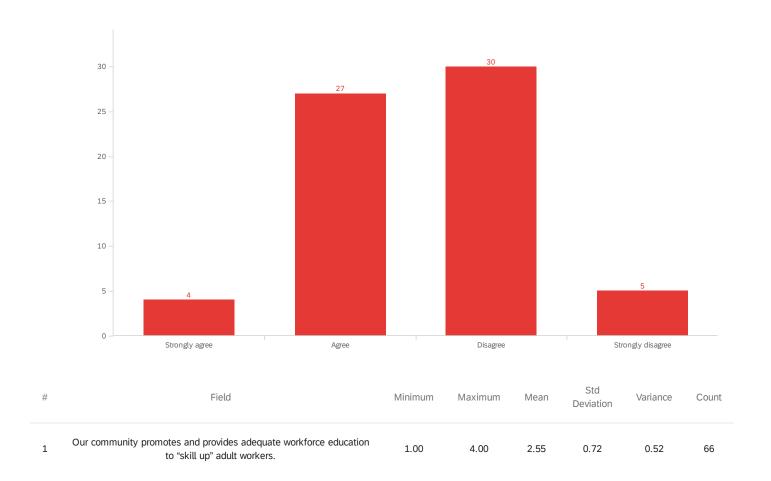

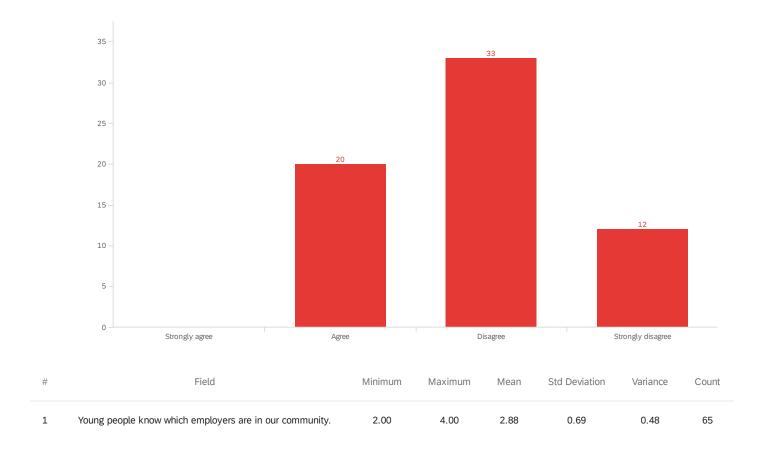

Q25 - The internet service I have at my home adequately serves my needs.



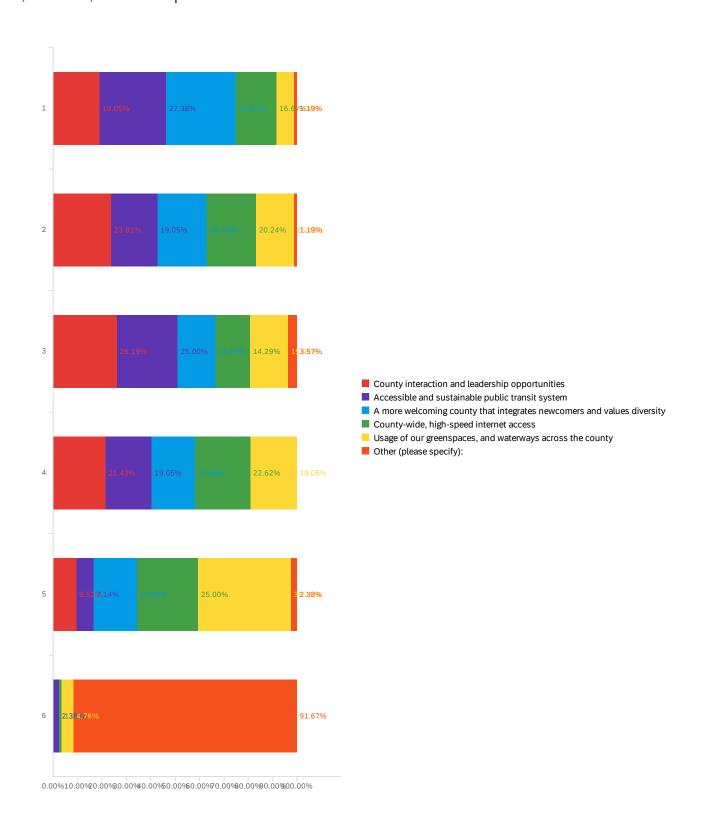

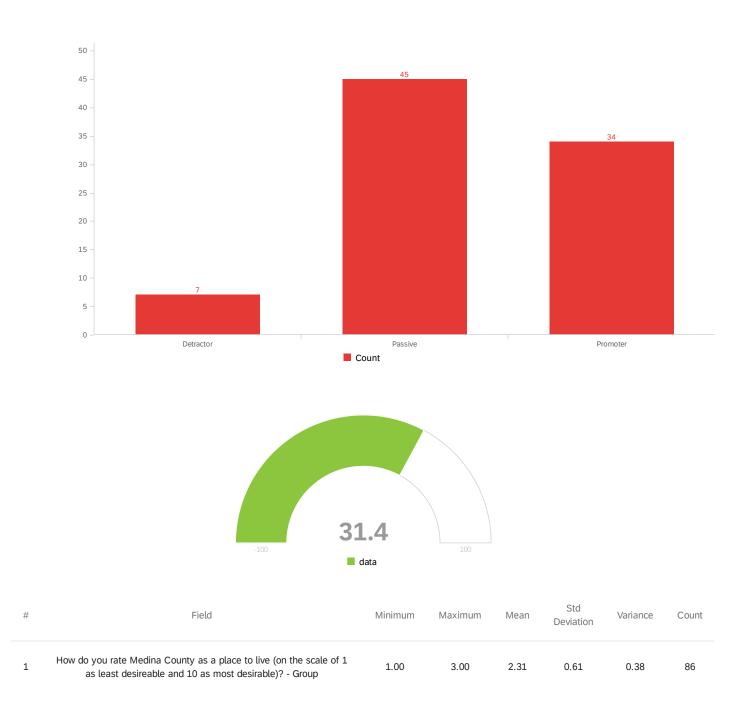

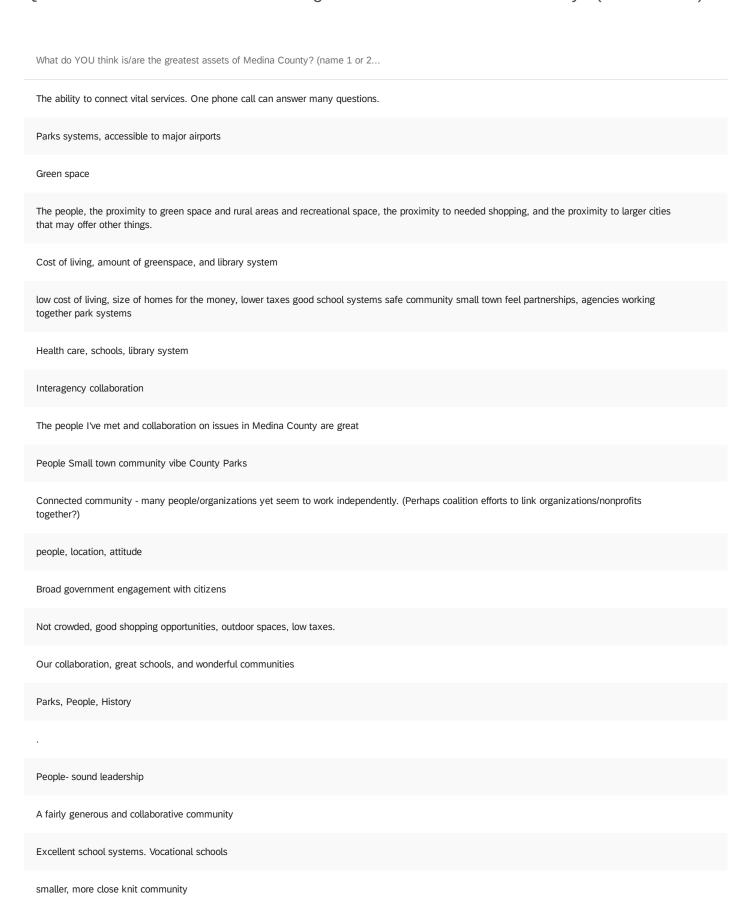

Q35 - Gender

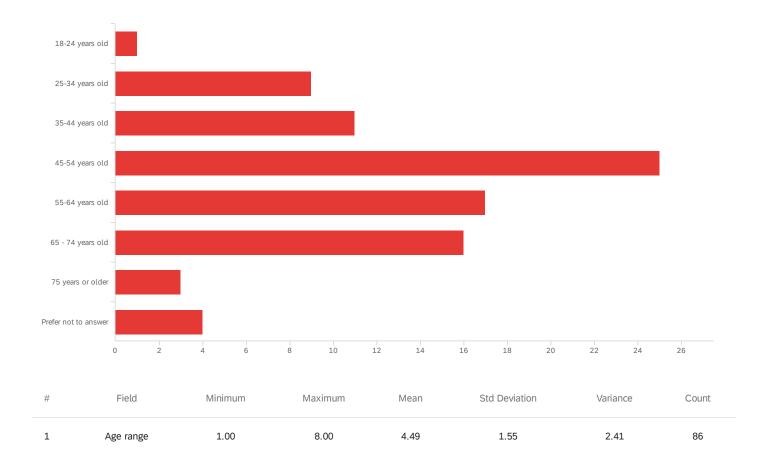

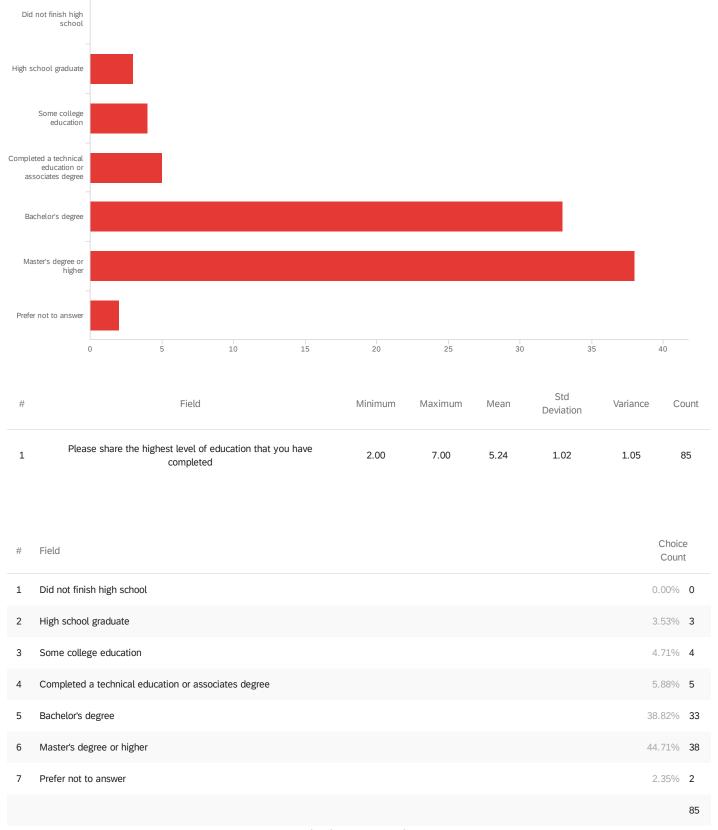

Q36 - Age range

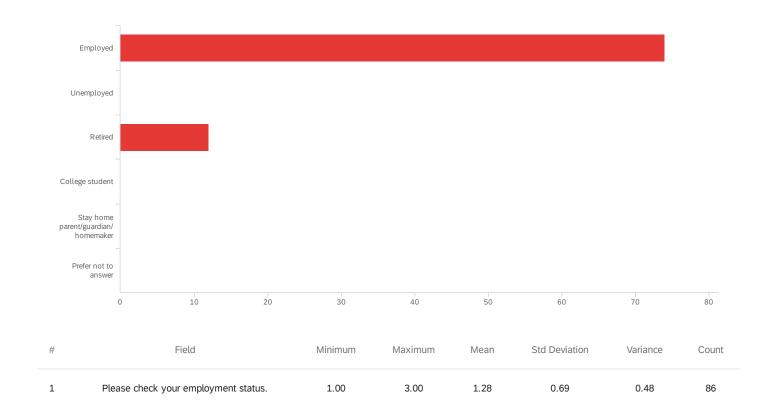

Q37 - Please share the highest level of education that you have completed

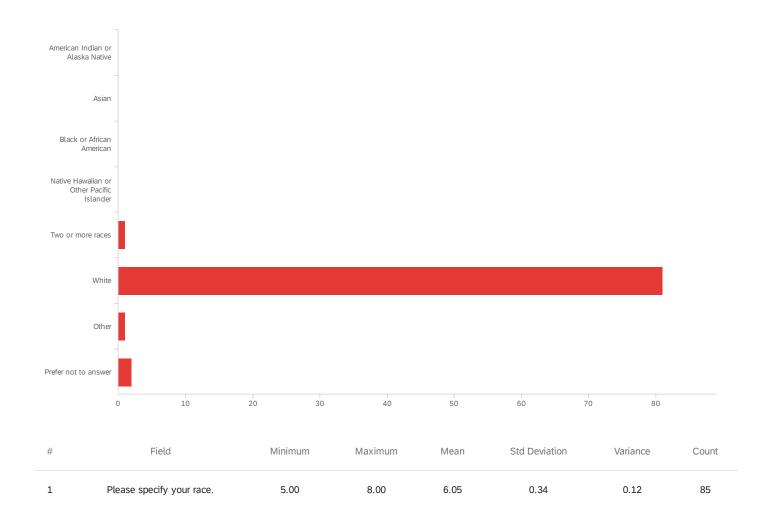

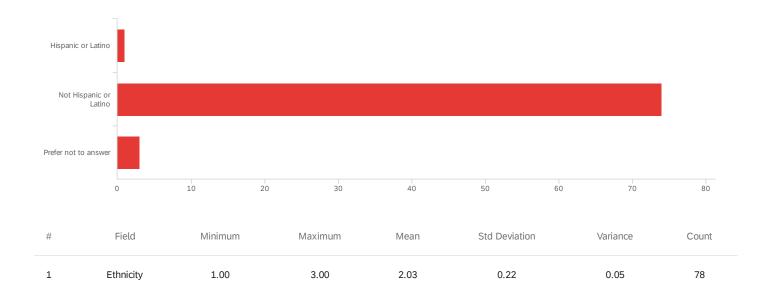
